The need to support the uptake of the IPBES assessments was also highlighted by many governments during IPBES-5. Additionally, the report reveals that "public sector investment in conservation remained at a much larger scale than private sector investment, with a reported \$31.7B tracked across the years 2009-2015." #### The CBD Secretariat Launches an E-Learning Platform for Biodiversity

further enhance capacity building, technical and scientific cooperation and technology transfer.

The platform provides a one-stop-access to e-learning modules and courses on topics related to the Convention on Biological Diversity, the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety and the Nagoya Protocol on Access and Benefit-Sharing. The modules are developed by the Secretariat in collaboration with partner organizations.

Parties, other Governments, relevant organizations, indigenous peoples and local communities and the public are encouraged to visit the platform and complete relevant e-learning modules available. Participants will be able to download certificates for each module they complete.

#### GBIF Opens Final BID Call for Proposals from Sub-Saharan Africa



GBIF invites the submission of concept notes for project funding from sub-Saharan Africa through Biodiversity Information for Development (BID) programme. This call seeks to support those projects from Sub-Saharan Africa which focus on the following areas: 1) Mobilizing biodiversity data, 2) Use and extend best practices for digitizing

natural history collections, 3) Apply biodiversity data in support of decision-making and research, or 4) Develop lasting national, regional or thematic networks to support ongoing data sharing and reuse. The submission deadline is 9th April 2017. More details on the application procedure here.

### UNDP Releases a Photo-Essay on the Implementation of Sustainable Ecosystem Management in Cuba



The photo-essay presents the results achieved by the Government of Cuba, in cooperation with UNDP and Global Environmental Facility GEF, in implementing a sustainable management of the Sabana-Camagüey Ecosystem. This project laid the ground for Cuba, partnering with UNDP and GEF, to build its current portfolio of interconnected environmental projects; from sustainable land management to ridge-to-reef approaches to ecosystem conservation, protection of mountain watersheds, management of invasive alien species, and ecosystem based approaches to climate change mitigation and adaptation.

### MedPAN Publishes the Main Findings on the Status of the Marine Protected Areas in the Mediterranean



MedPAN and RAC/SPA conducted an assessment on the Marine Protected Areas (MPA) on Mediterranean. Based on the report, the coverage of MPA's on Mediterranean is increasing year by year, accounting currently to approximately 7% of the sea's surface. Conservation International (CI) announced a new fellowship initiative called "Lui-Walton Innovators Fellowship Program".
